Haaretz wrote about **Tami Kanazawa and Yuval Admoni**: "The veteran duo's playing raised the event to another level." The JP referred to them as "having a refined musical taste," while Maariv called their performance "polished and spectacular." A married couple in real life, the duo won first place in five international competitions: Oslo, Osaka, Sicily, Rome, and Tokyo. Performing regularly in recitals and with leading Israeli orchestras resulted in their winning the Ministry of Culture Award for an Outstanding Chamber Ensemble. They have performed in thirty countries, accompanied by rave reviews. Carnegie Hall in New York, Teatro Argentina in Rome, Casals Hall in Tokyo, Budapest Congress Hall, and Bulgaria Concert Hall in Sofia are only a partial list of venues where their concerts took place. In addition, they performed at the Hungarian Spring Festival, the KLAVIER FESTIVAL in Germany, Duets by the Baltic Sea in St. Petersburg, the Pacific Coast Festival in Canada, Dialogues by the Black Sea in Ukraine, and the International Music Festival in Bulgaria. Israeli Festivals include the Upper Galilee Voice of Music Festival, the Felicja Blumenthal Festival, the Israel Festival, the Jerusalem Piano Festival, and the Israeli Music Festival. Their performances were broadcast on KAN Kol Hamuzika in Israel, CBC Canada, BBC London, the Japanese Broadcasting Authority (NHK), Tokyo FM, and the Bulgarian, Polish, and Hungarian national radio stations. The duo has recorded Liszt's symphonic poems for two pianos with NEXUS (applauded in International Piano and Fanfare) and two-piano rhapsodies with ROMEO RECORDS. Kanazawa-Admoni instruct duos at the Buchman-Mehta School of Music at Tel Aviv University and give international piano masterclasses in Israel, Russia, Japan, Korea, Serbia, and Canada.
